## SERVE's Family Care Shelter to Expand by 4,000 Square Feet!



We're expanding – by 4,000 square feet! Just two years after our merger with SERVE, we are proud to announce an expansion to the Prince William facility which will increase shelter capacity from 60 to 92 beds, allowing NVFS to reach an additional 250 individuals a year. The expansion will be a signature project for HomeAid in celebration of 10 years of service in Northern Virginia. The project also commemorates 35 years of commitment on the SERVE campus to help shelter and stabilize families in the Greater Prince William region.

NVFS is privileged to have the assistance of HomeAid partnering with K. Hovnanian Homes to be the Builder Captain for this expansion, which means they will contribute their time and talent to overseeing all of the work. Total project costs are estimated to be close to \$1.2 million, much of that being donated through valuable partnerships that K. Hovnanian and HomeAid will leverage. In addition, the Freddie Mac Foundation has

## When it All Comes Together For Good: Health Access for Shelter Residents

In April we were able to continue our commitment to improving all aspects of our clients' lives by creating a partnership for a health van to come to SERVE every other week. We immediately knew the program was a success because on its first day it helped to identify a serious illness for one of our youngest clients.

Monica Cruz is a single mother who is pregnant and is staying at the family care shelter with her two-year-old daughter, Kaylie. One day Kaylie, who is usually a ball of energy, was lethargic and coughing, and the staff could sense Monica's concern was growing. The staff asked what was wrong and Monica responded Kaylie had a cough that was

not going away, but she didn't have health insurance so she was hesitant to go to the doctor. A couple hours later, Monica saw the health van and the nurse practitioner agreed to squeeze in Kaylie even though she did not have an appointment.

The nurse practitioner told shelter staff Monica needed to take Kaylie to the emergency room immediately. Shelter staff arranged for transportation to and from the emergency room.

*"A nurse practitioner and a nurse always come with the van. As our referrals grow, we are hoping that we can have this service come to campus every week! It is a full medical office on wheels!"*

When Monica returned to the shelter, she informed the staff Kaylie had pneumonia. Monica had received prescriptions for her daughter, but did not have health insurance so NVFS purchased the prescriptions and taught Monica how to give the medication and Nebulizer treatment to Kaylie. Two days later, Kaylie was back to running around and laughing – cough free!

We are very excited about the health van because it supports our strategic approach to integrating our programs and services at various locations. It was made possible because NVFS is continuing to forge partnerships which allow us to continue to invest and improve lives from a holistic perspective.

The health van visits the campus every other week and can typically take five to six appointments per day. The nurse practitioner and nurse who come with the van are able to provide health screenings, dental screenings, medication reviews, and general wellness checkups. In the future, we hope the health van can come weekly. Thanks to the Greater Prince William Health Center, and their executive director, Frank Principi, for making this service possible.

committed \$400,000 to NVFS for the project. The expansion is further supported through Community Development Block Grants and private donations. Ongoing operations of SERVE are funded through a combination of local government support, individual contributions, foundations and state grants through the VA Dept. of Housing and Community Development.

“This expansion meets a critical need for emergency, short-term housing in the Prince William County area,” said John Monacci, Board President of HomeAid Northern Virginia and Senior VP of Winchester Homes. “Bringing together all of these resources and partners to undertake an expansion of this magnitude is what HomeAid does every single day. It’s all about providing homeless families and individuals with the opportunity to gain stability and to plan for their futures.”

The expansion will include the addition of a family support wing designed for larger families and flexible living space. In addition, adequate computer, mentoring and child services areas will promote appropriate family structured time, providing environments for learning and development. There will also be ample meeting space to support small group interactions and counseling support through life skills training, job development, case management and housing search assistance.
