NVFS Among First to Receive Grant from Bezos Day 1 Families Fund to End Family Homelessness in Northern Virginia

On Nov. 20, the Day 1 Families Fund announced it will invest \$2.5 million in Northern Virginia Family Service's (NVFS) efforts to end family homelessness in the region. The grant will help fund NVFS' unwavering people-centric approach to continue to pursue solutions to family homelessness. Funding from the grant will go toward housing after shelter and providing families with services, skills training and job support needed in transitioning to and remaining in permanent housing.

"Receiving an investment from the Day 1 Families Fund is truly an honor," said Stephanie Berkowitz, NVFS president and CEO. "For nearly a century, NVFS has been an innovator in solving the most critical community issues. This investment will accelerate NVFS' efforts in implementing and developing solutions, models and practices to address family homelessness in Northern Virginia.
