# Virginia Welcomes Health Coverage for Adults

Starting January 1, 2019, adults may qualify for Medicaid!

#### Who is Eligible?

Legal Virginia residents, ages 19 to 64 NOT already in or eligible for Medicare

Individuals NOT born in the US, who meet LPR status of a minimum of 5 years with a 10 year work history could qualify

Must meet income requirements, which vary by household size



#### **Documents required**

#### for the application event:

- 1. Social Security numbers (or document numbers for any legal immigrants who need insurance)
- 2. Employer and income information for everyone in your family (for example, from pay stubs, W- 2 forms or wage and tax statements)
- 3. Policy numbers for any current health insurance
- 4. Information about any job- related health insurance available to your family

Ask the Medicaid Health Plans about their special health and/or dental services
