


Because of you, NVFS continues to meet the moment—providing essential support today while building a stronger Northern Virginia for tomorrow.

FINDING STABILITY, CONFIDENCE, AND A NEW CAREER PATH:

KARLA'S JOURNEY THROUGH TRAINING FUTURES

When Karla first learned about NVFS' Training Futures program, she was juggling multiple part-time jobs, caring for her four children, and searching for a way forward.

"I'm a single mother of four," she shared. "I worked so hard but still couldn't provide the life I wanted for my children. I knew I needed to find a new path."

Originally from Bolivia, Karla came to the United States more than 20 years ago, finished high school here, and later dedicated herself to caring for her family. But when her marriage ended, she found herself rebuilding her life after surviving domestic violence.



BUILDING SKILLS—AND BELIEF IN HERSELF

From the first day, Karla knew she had found something special. Training Futures helped her strengthen her English, learn professional communication, and build computer and business skills. But the biggest transformation was internal.

"The most important thing I learned was to believe in myself. I realized I am capable and intelligent. I just needed the chance."

Training Futures also offered space for vulnerability and community. Karla remembers one powerful moment when she shared a deeply personal childhood story during a class presentation.

"I cried while I told it. But that day changed everything. We didn't just see each other as classmates anymore—we became friends. We supported each other."

"I was alone here. I needed stability—for me, and for [my children]."

Though she worked as a hairdresser and assistant cosmetology instructor, steady work was hard to find. Karla began searching for training programs and discovered Training Futures through a local women's center.

"I was excited, but I was also shy and scared," she admitted. "My English wasn't strong and I didn't have office experience. I didn't even know how to turn on a computer—I was afraid I might break it."

A NEW CAREER— AND A NEW BEGINNING

With the program’s guidance, Karla explored new career paths and found a strong fit in the banking industry—something she had never considered before. Today, she works as a Universal Banker, training for six months after beginning as a teller.

“I handle transactions, help customers, and I’m learning so much. I never imagined myself in banking, but now I can see a future there.”

This job didn’t just transform her career—it transformed her family’s life.

“We were homeless for about five months. After I got the job, I was able to rent an apartment and give my kids a home again. They’re happy—and that means everything to me.”

Now, Karla has a steady schedule, time with her children, and the stability she once feared she would never find.

“When my kids go to school, I go to work. I’m home when they’re home. I can plan things with them. I can be present.”

A NEW CHAPTER FULL OF HOPE

For Karla, Training Futures was more than a class—it was a lifeline after hardship and survival.

“It was the beginning of a new life for my family and me. I found skills, confidence, and community. I am not alone anymore.”

She still keeps in touch with her cohort, celebrating milestones and cheering one another on.

***“We continue supporting each other.
We all started again—together.”***

Karla’s journey reflects the power of opportunity, community, and resilience—and the impact supporters make every day through NVFS programs like Training Futures.

“Training Futures opened the door to a better life,” she said.

COMMUNITY PARTNER SPOTLIGHT: *APPLE FEDERAL CREDIT UNION*

A Partnership Rooted in Compassion, Service, and Community

At Northern Virginia Family Services, we are fortunate to have partners who show up year after year to make a tangible difference for local families. DONOR & VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: GEORGE LANE

A Legacy of Commitment, Compassion, and Community



More than 30 years ago, George Lane attended his first CARE Awards meeting almost by accident. At the time, he was working for a consulting firm whose owner had partnered with then-NVFS President Mary Agee to launch the awards, recognizing family-friendly workplaces. When asked by his boss to fill in at a meeting, George hesitated—he didn't know anything about NVFS or CARE. "She told me, 'Don't worry, you'll be fine,'" he recalls. "And more than 30 years later, here I am—still hanging around!"

That one meeting sparked a lifelong connection. The idea that businesses share a responsibility for the wellbeing of their employees resonated deeply with George and inspired him to stay involved. Over the years, his engagement grew—from volunteering at the Thrift Shop and supporting Training Futures to serving on the NVFS Board of Directors. "I was deeply impressed with the depth and breadth of services NVFS provides and the thousands of people it serves every year," he says.

Among his many memories, one stands out vividly. Shortly after 9/11, as a member of the Board, George learned that NVFS had been selected to administer the Survivors Fund, providing critical support to families affected by the tragedy. "What an honor and acknowledgment of the excellence NVFS would bring to this critical and emotional role," he reflects. That experience also gave him his first opportunity to work closely with Stephanie Berkowitz, now NVFS President & CEO. "It quickly became evident why she was tapped for that role—and why she would eventually go on to lead the entire organization."

When asked what keeps him connected after three decades, George doesn't hesitate:

"The people. From leadership to staff, NVFS continually attracts an incredible array of employees. The dedication and enthusiasm everyone brings to their work is infectious."

He's equally inspired by NVFS' volunteers and community partners: "The fact that NVFS continues to attract such strong volunteer support year after year is further evidence of the respect this organization has earned."

George's belief in NVFS' mission runs so deep that he has chosen to include the organization in his will—ensuring his impact continues for generations to come. "NVFS has enriched my life in so many ways," he shares. "It's given me incredible people, inspiring stories, and the joy of knowing that our work makes others' lives better. The end of my time shouldn't mark the end of that appreciation."
